

A Letter from the Director

As a father of three who has spent nearly his entire life in Ste. Genevieve, I've witnessed the remarkable transformation and growth that our small community has undergone. I vividly recall the scent of the library from its days in the old Koetting building, the carpet squares we eagerly grabbed during story time, and the joy of checking out as many books as we wanted as kids. That building, now known to my kids as a Dinosaur museum, doesn't even resemble its former self!

While we fondly look back on these memories, I can't help but reflect on the significant progress our community has made. The old library is gone, replaced by an even larger and more valuable community asset. However, the memories of that location linger. One constant has been the enduring presence of the library in our community. What began as a simple Library Club initiated by a group of citizens slowly evolved into a partnership with the Chamber of Commerce, followed by collaboration with Ozark Regional Library, ultimately leading to the establishment of our independent library location.

I can't help but imagine that if the original Library Club members returned, they would be pleased to see how their hard work has paid off. The library, once sharing space with a museum and charging 2 cents a day for book loans, outgrew its space twice before settling into our current location.

Regardless of when your library memories began, we all have stories that define our generations—stories uniquely ours, passed down to children and grandchildren who may struggle to comprehend, but will proudly share with their own descendants, saying, "Your grandpa came here when this was the library!"

I present to you our 2023 Annual Report, wherein you'll find evidence of the creativity required to nurture an exceptional library. While financial resources are finite, collaboration and creativity are the boundless resources we will tap into to support the library's mission.

I have no idea what the future holds for our library or where we will be in 20 years, but I can assure you that our library is stronger than ever.

With the support of the St. Louis Chess Club, which donated 2 clocks and over 12 chess boards to help us bring chess education to Ste. Genevieve County.







TOTAL ITEMS CIRCULATED




















































TOTAL ANNUAL CHECKOUTS BY AGE GROUP

TECHNOLOOGY HIGHLIGHTS

Ste. Genevieve County Library had 14 computers for patron usage at the close of FY 2023. These computers offer internet access as well as access to our OPAC (Online Public Access Catalog) Microsoft Office products and Ancestry Library edition. We also offer free public access Wi-fi for patron and guest users. Both of these services are accessed and checked much the same way as a book.



Our new VR Books allows patrons to check out a book and pair of glasses and utilize their phones and an app to make the stories come to life!





Our collection includes six laptops to help provide Tech Classes in our meeting room and allow people to check them out to work throughout the library.



Both Purchases with donor money in 2022, the large format printer and 3D printer have been a huge asset to our community. From printing of birthday banners or commercial blue prints, to our Bad Art Night trophy. Both of these pieces of equipment have seen significant use!
