Letter from the Director

By all accounts, 2024 has felt like the fastest year since I began writing these Annual Reports. Each one marks another year of growth and change for our library, and creating them is no small task. They take months of effort—gathering data, analyzing digital and physical checkouts, and compiling every detail into a document that may or may not land on your reading list.

But this year feels different. There's an energy in the air, a sense that we're standing on the brink of something truly transformative for our little library. In December 2023, we took a bold step forward by hiring Aaron Cohen & Associates to guide us in developing our Strategic Plan. After years of trying to tackle this process on our own, our board decided it was time to bring in expert help. To say we were excited and inspired is an understatement.

We started 2024 with an online survey that received an incredible 180 responses from community members, sharing their hopes and dreams for the library. The year ended with a comprehensive 90-page strategic plan—a roadmap for our future that our board has studied intently since its completion in November.

This plan was created with one vision in mind: the future. What will it look like? How do we get there? Part of my role this year was to delve into our history to better understand how far we've come. In 2023, we explored the roots of our library system, discovering that our services predate the state library system itself. That legacy continued when my grandparents voted in 1960 to ensure the library's future—a future they could only dream of, and one we now have the privilege of shaping.

With this new strategic plan in hand, we're not just looking ahead to the next few years; we're building a foundation to ensure the library remains vibrant and relevant for generations to come. It's my hope that as you read this report, you'll see what I see: a library that is well-loved and well-used by the community it serves. Together, in ways big and small, we are writing the next chapter in its history.

Top 5 Digital Checkouts by Platform



































Technology Highlights

Ste. Genevieve County Library had 10 computers for patron usage at the close of FY 2023. These computers offer internet access as well as access to our OPAC (online Public Access Catalog) Microsoft office products and Ancestry Library edition. We also offer free public access Wi-Fi for patron and guest users. Both of these services are accessed and checked out much the same way as a book.



Missouri Evergreen

This year Missouri Evergreen has seen tremendous growth. 12 new member libraries joined the consortium bringing our total partner libraries to 76 libraries with 4.5 million available items.

Using Evergreen means that our collection is constantly working. If our library doesn't have a book, we can search 75 other libraries for a title. It also means that our our entire collection is available for millions of patrons rather than just our community!



The benefit of these annual reviews allows us to identify issues or concerns in our library services. By reviewing both our E-Book/E-Audiobook numbers and Evergreen request numbers going down, we feel that this is showing us that our community is utilizing our online resources before requesting books outside of our own library.
